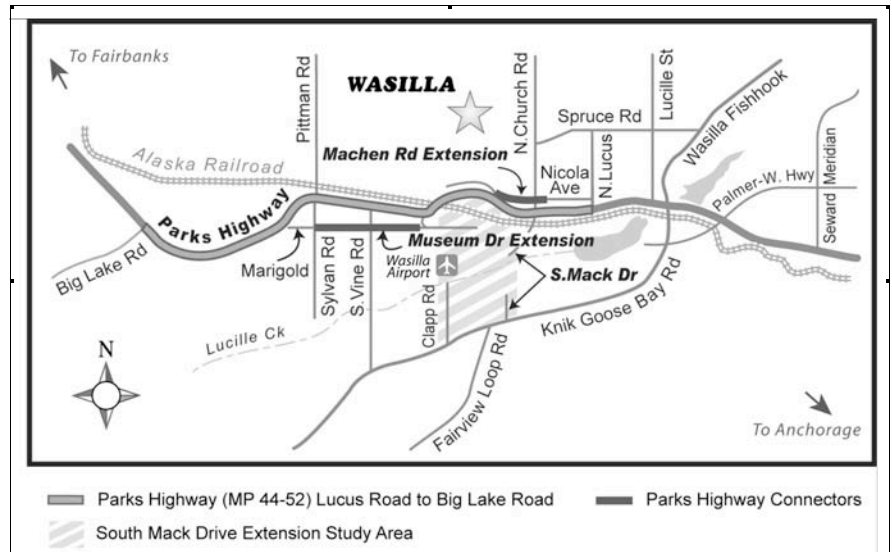
## Parks Highway Connectors Museum Drive Extension

MSB Project No. 30090

*If you notice surveyors and other project staff in your area, there is a good reason. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough, with funding from the state Legislature, has plans to make it easier and safer for you to get around.*

### Project Scope

The borough hired the engineering firm Hattenburg, Dilley and Linnell LLC (HDL) to proceed with engineering and environmental studies to extend Museum Drive 1.9-miles westward to connect with Sylvan Road. The extension would hook up to Marigold Drive, completing a connection all the way to the Parks Highway just west of Pittman Road. The road is envisioned as a two-lane road with shoulders.



### Project Description

This area of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough has grown rapidly in recent years, resulting in a boom in land development and a corresponding increase in local traffic, and traffic crashes. The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (ADOT&PF) has designated the Parks Highway from Lucus Road to the Alaska Railroad Houston crossing as a safety corridor in an effort to reduce crash rates. ADOT&PF is in the environmental assessment phase of a project to upgrade the Parks Highway from Lucus Road to Big Lake Road, milepost 44-52, to a 4-lane divided highway with limited access. However, available funds to construct the Parks Highway: Lucus Road to Big Lake Road project may be years away, and the project does not include funding to purchase right of way for frontage roads.

The Museum Drive extension on the south side of Parks Highway, and the related Machen Road extension on the north side, is an outgrowth of discussions and cooperation between the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, ADOT&PF and City of Wasilla. They recognize the need for additional collector roads to be constructed in conjunction with the Parks Highway project to help alleviate traffic congestion, reduce accidents, better distribute local traffic, and improve access to the local community and businesses.

### Project Status and Timeline

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough received funds to design and construct the Museum Drive and the Machen Road connections in 2008. In May 2009, HDL received the go-ahead to begin design and produce bid-ready plans by late 2010. Construction could begin as early as 2011.
